WANG HUA



Born in Chinese autonomus region of Xinjiang in 1990, Wanghua graduated from Central Saint Martins College of Art and Design in 2012, then moved to Jingdezhen, China, the home of porcelain in 2014. She received her Masters in Ceramics and Glass at the RCA in 2018.

As part of a generation of Chinese artists who grew up during a period of rapid urbanization, Wanghua uses a wide range of different media and methods to translate philosophical ideas. Finding inspiration in Chinese idioms and allusions, as well as in Western visual culture, her works are a surreal interpretation of the imperfect physical world. They bring the viewer into a reality with overlapping time frames, where everything is metaphysical. Even though ceramic is certainly Wanghua main employed material, she surely does not want to limit herself, as every material has different characteristics and properties. She considers her works a fable, which can express the artist's feelings and story.
